Wexford Board News by Don Michalski

The Wexford Watch will be following a new format, effective with this issue. Rather than being published every two months, the Wexford Watch will be presented four times a year, i.e., spring, summer, autumn, and winter.

This is in partial response to the limits of valuable resources (i.e. editing, publishing costs and distribution). The Wexford Watch is always available on the Wexford Village website. Another consideration that could be made is the electronic distribution of the newsletter with a carrier such as Constant Contact. Your thoughts and insights on this subject are very welcome to the Wexford Board. Wexford Village is arranging the final details of the new mowing contract for our greenways (2009-2012). We have had bids and proposals for this project. Typically, we ask for an "up to four year proposal". Since the grass mowing maintenance consumes over 40% of the Wexford annual budget, we view this proposal with great diligence. After all, it is our money.

The social events for Wexford Village are on the horizon, Easter Egg Hunt (April 11th), Garage Sale (May 8th and 9th), and the Fourth of July Picnic. We always need volunteers, so please consider giving an hour or two of your time. It appears that the demographics of Wexford Village are changing again, as the first generations of residents are leaving, we are seeing a new generation of young families, as evidenced by the popularity of the primarily children events: Easter Egg Hunt and the July 4th picnic/parade.

A very big thanks goes out to Ken Schmidt, Jerry Watts, and all volunteers for their hard work on the ice rinks this year. They were enjoyed by many skaters.

Additional work on the bike paths will occur again this year. A major reason for the increased dues (\$10) for this year has been the specific designation of those funds to maintain our 6 miles of bike/walking paths. Again, periodic maintenance will prevent costly replacement in the future.

Water Safety Tips from SwimWest

Summer is a great time to enjoy the pools and lakes of Wisconsin. It is important for adults and children to know how to be safe in and around the water.

- Drain kiddie pools when they are not in use.
- Never let your children swim unattended. Supervise children closely even when a lifeguard is present.
- Learn how to swim, tread water, float, and get yourself out of the water.
- Set water safety rules for each member of the family based on swimming abilities.
- Know potential hazards of the area such as deep water, drop offs, currents, and obstructions.
- If a child is missing, check the water first.
- Alcohol and boating don't mix. Over 50 percent of drownings result from boating incidents involving alcohol.
- When boating, all passengers should wear Coast Guard-approved life jackets.
- Watch for anyone getting too tired, too cold, too far from safety, too much sun, or too much strenuous activity.

He was able to get over 70 families to sign the document. He then worked with Paul Skidmore, and was able to personally present the petition to the Madison Common Council. According to Alder Skidmore, the council was impressed with the presentation and concern by the neighborhood. Alder Skidmore has told us that city engineering will now redesign this intersection to make it safer for both vehicles and pedestrians. We will also have crosswalks painted. At this time, we don't have anymore details on what the city will do, when it will be done, but supposedly it will be done this year. We will keep you posted. A very big thank you to all who signed the petition and helped make a difference.
