Trail Update

The 250 linear feet of path adjacent to Applehill Circle was re-graded and resurfaced at the cost of \$4000. Bartelt Paving also resurfaced several paths that did not weather well after the 2008 application. In the future, we will focus more on filling cracks and less on resurfacing. The paths have a life expectancy of several decades and proper maintenance will delay any major reconstruction. An estimate for completely repaving all paths is near \$500,000.

PKK Lighting removed three light poles and re-

placed them with a centralized light near Applehill Circle and East Newhaven at the cost of \$1100.

TDS and White Construction installed and enhanced a fiber-optic network. There was significant digging and trenching that created barren surfaces on private yards and Wexford greenways. These areas were seeded and protected with straw. This application should adequately restore the grass. Any concerns of incomplete restoration may be addressed to TDS.

Home Modifications

If you are considering modifying the exterior or changing the footprint of your residence, you must seek approval of the Wexford Architectural Review Committee. The Director of the City Planning division has verified that the City of Madison will NOT approve any plans for any building permit unless already approved by Wexford Village.

Garbage Collection

The City of Madison wants to remind residents not to place garbage and recycling bins curbside more than 24 hours prior to pickup. Please, remove all bins within 24 hours after pickup and do not leave the bins in front yards.

Traffic Circle

The traffic circle at the intersection of Sawmill and Westfield Road was widened to let vehicles pass more easily, and the pedestrian crosswalks were painted.

Landscaping

Eight of the thirty-four Wexford circle islands were cut, trimmed, and landscaped by members of the Wexford Board. Since we did not use a contractor, we saved several thousands of dollars. Our only expense was a new chain saw for Wexford Village.

Residents living adjacent to the bike paths should trim bushes, trees, and plants so they don't impede pedestrians or bikers

We also remind all residents that the Wexford covenants and City of Madison statutes require that home exteriors and yards are maintained with the timely mowing of grass, trimming of trees and shrubs, weeding, removal of litter from the yards, and shoveling of

snow. This is an aesthetic concern and a goodneighbor practice.

If you have any concerns about the appearance of your circle island or questions about ownership of vegetation near pathways, contact any board member.

2010 Budget

Wexford Village is below budget in for 2010. As of this publication, we do not anticipate increasing the Wexford fees for 2011 from the current \$90 for individual homes and \$45 for condos.

The following is a breakdown of Wexford Village expenses:

Contracts for the maintenance of Wexford Village greenways remain with the following contractors:

- 1. Snowplowing by MCJ Services \$2200 (not including December snow falls), removal of snow from sidewalks in nine areas adjacent to Wexford greenways and a 600 foot section of sidewalk at the intersection of Old Sauk Road and Gammon Road.
- 2. Greenway cutting by Barnes \$23,000, for 20 contracted cuttings of greenways per year. We exceeded the contracted number of cuttings this year due to an early growing season, but because we have contracted with Barnes for over 15 years, they did not charge for the additional cuttings.

3. Lighting by PKK - We have about 100 light poles dispersed along our 30,000 linear feet of walking/bike paths. At this point, we have not had any major repair issues aside from the occasional lights burning out or perpetual lights on. Typically, we do the last check of lights in mid November. No additional work on the light repair will be made during the winter unless there is an issue of personal safety. We have just completed the task of painting numbers on the all

light poles and mapped them to a grid. Rather than reporting a location problem, residents need only to identify the problem and the pole number.

4. Greenway herbicide/fertilizing by Tru-Green - Tru-Green applied a fall fertilizer and broad leaf herbicide to the

Wexford greenways. Because of significant invasion by crabgrass in many of the greenways and islands, the board is considering applying an early spring application of herbicide/crabgrass prevention. Both programs cost about \$2200 per application. An organic option was considered but was not cost effective.

A summary chart of some of the big ticket items in our budget is below.
