Grounds Keeping

This is the second year for the application of a crab grass prevention herbicide on all Wexford Village greenways. This is a part of our maintenance program to prevent the invasion of crabgrass. This is in addition to the fertilizer and broadleaf herbicide application that was done in late September.

As mentioned previously, we have a five-year contract with Barnes, Inc. for cutting grass on all greenways and island circles with an annual cost of about \$22,500. With the early spring, however, we might require more than the

standard twenty cuttings. Any extra cutting will cost Wexford Village an additional \$1200 per mowing. (Note: Wexford Village mowing costs have risen from about \$18,000 during the mid 1990s to the present contract of \$22,500. An increase of approximately 1.5% per year.)

Weather also had an effect on our snow removal costs. Our annual budget for snow removal is \$5000, but because of the low snow totals this year, our costs were only \$1000.

New Stoplight on Old Sauk Road

A new stoplight was installed at the intersection of Old Sauk Road and North Westfield in late 2011.

Typically, homeowners in the area of a new stoplight are required to finance the install, but the City of Madison determined that individual households in Wexford Village were not generating more than 10 trips per day at the intersection, and therefore not responsible for all of the traffic and were not assessed. However, each individual unit within Saukdale Condominiums was assessed because the City of

Madison's contension that the condominium association represents one parcel, and as whole, generates more than 10 trips per day.

Because of the discrepancy with the application of the regulation, the Wexford Village Board, along with many other city organizations, has voted to support the Saukdale Condominium Association in their disagreement with the City of Madison's interpretation of the fairness regarding the special assessment policy.
