4. Old Business

• Jim Driscoll - Owner of PKK Lighting presented options for replacement of lights on South Thornhill to South Woodmont. Don talked to residents in vicinity. Most desired lighting as it existed prior to vandalism with the coach light style. Original lighting fixture is no longer available. 14 poles damaged. Recommended pole has tar coating to eliminate chemical reaction of rotting. 14 poles removed and wires secured. Lamps replaced where applicable. Parts gathered to fix 8 fixtures. Need to decide: pole height, fixture type, lightage watts, etc... Entire project can be accomplished with the \$8138.00 reimbursement from the vandalism. Discussion of increased spacing between poles but would be too costly due to having to re-wore. Also expressed concern on keeping light bases more stable to prevent kids from breaking lights. A more vandal-resistant pole would exceed cost by \$4000+.

Motion: Accept the original proposal (14 poles, 6 fixtures) with tougher poles and new light fixture at approximately \$8138.00. Jim will investigate concrete base around pole for additional strength. We will add if not too much of an additional cost. Motion seconded and passed. To be done mid November.

5. New Business

- Elderly concerns Many complaints from Saukdale and High Point condo residents that they pay dues for nothing. Can we do anything for them?
- Wexford Prairie (Lot 400) mowing concerns. Trees dying from lack of water.
 Action Item: Don will call Barnes and ask if they can water trees. Possible entrance via Jerry Storlie's at 1010 and 1012 N. Gammon Road.
- Branford Lane W, swimming pool. Fence height issue. City issue.
- Ken will pen a generic letter for overgrown trees.
