Everyone is invited to participate in two of the Wexford Village social events. First is the Annual Easter Egg hunt that will be held on Saturday April 10th, 9:30 AM at Wexford Park. Events include a visit by the Easter Bunny, Easter Egg Hunt, and socialization with other parents in the shelter area. To participate, please drop off 1 dozen plastic eggs filled with candy and/or treats at one of three drop off sites prior to that date, 5 Red mound Circle, 21 Drum hill Circle, and 1018 N Westfield Road.. Last year and estimated 125-150 children participated in the event.

Wexford Village has signs at two major entrances for our Association, Old Sauk & Westfield and Sawmill & Gammon. The City of Madison is considering a project that involves a major water management endeavor associated with the new cogeneration plant that is being built on the UW campus. Before any water reallocation from Tiedeman's or Stricker's Pond can be made, the City of Madison will be doing some preliminary tests to verify that the water can be percolated from Wexford Park . There will be some drilling and testing in Wexford Park within the next few weeks to make that determination.

As warmer weather arrives, please be vigilant about nuisance activity and consider activating your Neighborhood Watch. Minimize your individual household susceptibility by keeping doors and windows closed and locked.

#### Alder News:

Greetings from your Alder,

Recently, the Governor vetoed AB633, which would prohibit municipalities from enacting minimum wage ordinances that are higher from State and Federal Minimum Wage laws. I support a higher minimum wage, but I do not support the effort to enact different minimum wage ordinances within individual municipalities.

Soon, the City Council will be debating whether to change the City's antismoking ordinance to prohibit all restaurants, taverns, bowling alleys, and hotel lobbies from allowing smoking. The vast majority of responses that I have received from constituents indicate to me that you are opposed to this change. I agree.

Alder Matt Sloan has introduced an ordinance to allow residents to raise chickens (hens only!) on their properties within the City of Madison. I have received a number of opinions and suggestions on this subject (about equally for and against). Some have opined that chickens in residential neighborhoods would not be a problem. Others have said that chickens would attract rats and vermin. I would really appreciate your opinion on this issue! I do know that we have many coyotes, foxes, raccoons, and Ferrell cats on the west side, and they would likely have an impact on the chicken population.

Traffic management continues to be the single most important problem, and source of complaints, within the 9th district. I have requested traffic studies on Westfield Road (at Farmington Road) and on Gammon Road (at Colony Drive) to help determine if we need additional traffic controls (a stop sign on Westfield and/or a traffic signal on Gammon Road at Tree Lane). I am working with various agencies and Alderman to make our streets safer. The Traffic Enforcement Team has been conducting operations on Gammon Road, Old Sauk Road, and Westfield Road to enforce speeding violations and determine the actual speed and traffic volume over a given period of time

Last month, the Madison Police Department released crime statistics for Madison for the year ending 2003. The year-end statistics indicate that, with the exception of homicide, crime dropped in 2003. These statistics are misleading. Even though overall crime in Madison dropped in 2003, crime in the West District (including the Ninth Aldermanic District) has increased. In particular, theft from autos and property crimes increased dramatically on the west side of Madison. It is important to keep this in mind to keep yourselves safe. The Madison Police Department has several simple suggestions to help make your families safer: (1) If possible, park your vehicles in your garage. (2) Keep your garage doors closed and locked all the time. (3) Keep the entrance doors to your home locked and lighted all the time. (4) Install a motion detector light at all entrance doors (or keep the light on at all times!) (5) If you're going away, tell you neighbors, so they will know if there is suspicious activity. (6) If you see anything suspicious, call the Madison Police Department, they will not be upset if there is not an imminent problem. (Please call LT. Tony Peterson at 288-6110 during the day, or police dispatch at 266-4275 at any time). If you witness a crime or accident in process, please call 911 immediately. Your help in keeping Madison a safe place to live is critical

The state legislature recently approved SB512 overwhelmingly, which would provide property tax exempt status for non-profit and elderly housing facilities such as





Attic Angels and Oakwood. If the Governor signs this legislation, Attic Angels and Oakwood would be able to continue to provide property tax exempt housing for senior citizens. However, the tax exempt status for properties in excess of 10 acres in a facility would continue to be an issue, and could result in further tax litigation.

Finally, there will be a city-wide election on April 6, 2004. We will be electing our County supervisors, a municipal judge, and Madison School Board representatives. Whoever who support, please make your opinion count by voting!
